Budgets, Fees & Exchange: FGIC Financial Ecosystem

One of our goals in creating this Forest Garden Immersion Course is to spread the practices of regenerative design and edible forest gardening as far and as fast as possible. We would like everyone who wants to come to this course to be able to attend, and to carry their learnings and passion back to their local communities. Many excited potential participants have contacted us asking for reduced fees, and so we offer this transparent explanation of our economic approach to the course. In the following sections we outline our open-book accounting, our process for choosing the sliding scale course fee, and our various approaches to making the course economically available to everyone who wants to come.

Open Books Accounting

Want to take a look at our books? Go for it! In the interest of complete transparency and increasing financial permaculture literacy, we've made our budget available to anyone who would like to understand the costs and considerations for putting on a course like the FGIC. The budget is included in this handbook, and is also viewable on googledocs here: http://spreadsheets.google.com/ccc?key=peq1ObMrzxqXQQP4QJrROCg&hl=en (You'll need a free google account to access.)

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Sliding Scale

To choose the sliding-scale fee for this course, we worked with the budget to find a balance between possible fee ranges, potential number of participants, estimated income, and estimated expenses. Tallying up our estimated expenses and dividing that amount between potential numbers of participants gave us a range of per-participant costs for the course – anywhere from \$350 to \$850. We decided to aim for a relatively low cost per participant (\$100-125 per day = \$400-500 for the course), which means that we need a good-sized group of folks (43 or more!) to achieve enough income to meet our expenses. Take a look at the enrollment scenarios on the budget to get a sense of these figures for your self.

This figure then becomes the low end of our sliding scale. We need a minimum of \$400 or \$500 from 43 or more participants to break even, and we are totally confident that we can do so! Now is the time for our society to re-discover local food-security and abundant, delicious forests of fruit!

Participants who have relatively greater access to financial resources are encouraged to pay on the higher end of the sliding scale, or to engage in exchanges with other participants without access to US dollar resources. Following are the various options we've put together to help make the FGIC available to everyone who wants to come. Enjoy, and we'll see you later this month!

Affiliate Program

For each person who attends the FGIC and sites you as having referred them, you get \$25. Go out and get your friends, family, neighbors, and community to attend the FGIC – the more the merrier.

Plant Trade

This is the second year we are offering this innovative program. To reduce your course fees and support the genetic diversity of forest gardens at Camp Epworth, simply bring along divisions of multifunctional perennials to plant in the herbaceous understory! Each plant you bring reduces your course fee by \$1, to a maximum of \$50 off. A list of desired & accepted plant species can be found on the blog and social network.

Work Trade

We have a total 8 openings for work trade at the FGIC, 4 positions in the kitchen and 4 positions with the implementation crew. Each participant holding a work trade position will work for 4 hours per day under the joyful direction of our head chef Zena or our project managers Benneth & Dyami. Work trade time is valued at \$10 per hour, so 4 hours per day for 4 days yields a total course fee reduction of \$160. We are now offering work trade positions on a first-come first-serve basis.

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Exchange System: Community Financial Support

To encourage creative economic interaction and valuing of non-US dollar resources and services, we are facilitating a brand-new exchange system for course participants AND the Hudson-valley local permaculture community. Here's how it works:

I want to come to the forest garden immersion course, but I'm traveling from several states away and can only afford \$250 of the course fee. However, I have some basic carpentry skills and I also produce artists charcoal from my home coppice plot. I head on over to the FGIC Social Network, and make a post about my money needs (just 150 bucks!) and my particular skill & product offers. Other people on the network (including both FGIC participants and permaculture/forest gardening folks from the local community) see my offers. Several people contact me to buy some artists charcoal, and one family asks if I could stay a day after the course to fix up a tool shed in their forest garden. I make \$200 from exchanging my products and services, happily attend the FGIC, and make some great connections with the local community.

Get creative with your offers! Many folks are happy to find some friendly help with manual outdoors or cleaning work indoors. Maybe some folks would like to set up another hands-on forest garden implementation just after the course, and need some FGIC-trained implementers or designers! Packing List

Due to the immersive nature of our forest gardening work together, we will be outside and inside over the course of the weekend. Please come prepared for every kind of weather, as it can rain, sleet, freeze, or be 60° and sunny in the Hudson Valley at this time of year.

Tools & Items for Course

- Notebook, clip board
- Writing implements
- A sketchbook or sketch paper & clipboard.
- A daypack for field trips.

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Bedding, Clothes, Personal

- Bring work clothes! Comfortable, durable outdoor clothing for our numerous hands-on sessions.
- Work gloves and hats wide brimmed Mexican or cowboy hats preferred.
- Sunblock!
- Rain gear! Warm waterproof work/rain/mud boots, warm waterproof jacket. Rain is great weather for planting.
- Long socks for tucking pants in, particularly if you have concern about ticks. (We will be walking through grasses and ticks will likely be present. Our staff will support you in staying safe and tick free. Prevention is key!)
- Warm clothes (that stay warm if wet wool and synthetics NOT cotton). The buildings can be chilly, so bring comfortable layers.
- NO LINENS OR PILLOWS ARE PROVIDED. Bring towels, sheets, blankets, sleeping bag, and pillow for a twin sized mattress.
- You may want slippers inside as the spaces are shoeless and floors will likely be cold.
- Flashlight (plus extra batteries).
- Toilet articles (shared bathroom!).
- Watch and/or travel alarm.
- Water bottle and personal mug.
- Mat, props, clothes, etc. for yoga or other practices.

Housing Description

There are two housing options for you at Camp Epworth: dormitory-style and camping. Both are equally priced and already covered in your course fee.

Dormitory housing is twin-sized bunk beds in rooms shared with 4-9 other same-sex individuals. Each room has a single shared bathroom and shower. Our dormitory, Rosebush, will have both men's and women's rooms.

Camping is abundant – Epworth has 160+ acres of open field and mixed woodlands, and you can camp pretty much anywhere you like. Shared bathrooms with showers are available in Rosebush; without showers in the Dining Hall.

Off-site accommodations are available, and qualify you for the Commuter's or returning participant's sliding scale fee of \$400-800. Two of our course sponsors, The Inn at Stone Ridge and Mohonk Mountain House, offer beautiful accommodations 5-10 minutes from Camp Epworth. Other local options include: Captain Schoonmaker Bed & Breakfast (845-687-7946), Sparrow Hawk Bed & Breakfast (845-687-4492), and The Paymaster's House (845-687-7204).

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Directions to Camp Epworth

Please arrive by 8:00 AM on Thursday, April 23rd, 2009 at Camp Epworth in High Falls, NY (registration runs until 9:00 AM). If you will need a pick-up from the airport, bus, or train station, please let us know exactly when you expect to arrive, and if you have a cell phone, what the number is. Please make arrangements in advance with Connor Stedman (connor.stedman@gmail.com) to ensure we can accommodate your travel needs.

The course ends by 5:30 PM on Sunday, April 26th. If your travel plans involve leaving on Monday, April 27th, let Connor know so we can work this out with Epworth -- Extra nights will cost more.

By Plane

Closest airports include: Stewart Airport in Newburgh, NY (1.5 hours drive) and Albany Airport in Albany, NY (2 hours drive), but there are no easy public transport connections to the High Falls area from these two airports. From New York City airports, you can take a Trailways Bus from the NYC Port Authority bus terminal to Rosendale, NY, about 15 minutes away. Please contact Connor if you plan to arrive at Rosendale so we can plan to pick you up.

By Bus or Train

Trailways Bus Lines has a station at the Park and Ride lot in Rosendale, NY about 15 minutes from Camp Epworth. You should be able to bus to there from almost anywhere. Trains from NYC arrive in Poughkeepsie, NY, about 45 minutes from Epworth. There is a shuttle from the train station to the Rosendale bus station. Please contact Connor if you plan to arrive at Rosendale so we can plan to pick you up.

By Car

From the South – Note: if you follow the mapquest or google directions, you may get lost up on the ridge. If you want a little less adventure, you can do the following: Take the NY Thruway/ Rt 87 north to Exit 18-New Paltz. At the end of the toll area, you will reach Rt. 299. Turn left/west on 299 toward New Paltz. Go down the hill into town and look for Rt 32 North. Turn right onto 32N. [It will turn right again at the end of a little road right after you get on.] Follow 32N about 7 miles, crossing over 2 metal bridges. After the second bridge, on which there is now construction, you will turn left at the traffic light, onto Rt. 213 West. There is a Stewart's on that corner. Proceed on 213W through the town of Rosendale then on to High Falls. At High Falls, you will cross another metal bridge. After that bridge you will come to a traffic light, with the High Falls Food Coop on the corner. Turn left at that corner onto Lucas Tpke/ Ulster County Rt.1. Go about 2½ miles down that road and you will see a big green sign on your left [which is lit at night], that says Epworth Camp and Retreat Center. Turn left into the sign and follow the directions below.

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From the North – Take the NY Thruway/Rt 87 south to Exit19-Kingston. After you exit, you will come to a traffic circle, but you do not enter the circle. You will see a sign to the right saying Rt. 28 West toward Pine Hill. I think it also says toward Rt.209. Turn onto 28W toward Pine Hill and immediately look for signs for Rt. 209. Take Rt. 209 South toward Ellenville. You will travel about 5 miles or more and will reach the town[s] of Marbletown and Stone Ridge. After you go through Stone Ridge, you will pass a little shopping mall on your left called Stone Ridge Towne Center. Soon after that you will reach a traffic light. Turn left at that light onto Rt. 213 East. Proceed on 213 E about a mile down a hill and you will reach a light, with High Falls Food Coop on the corner. Turn right at that light onto Lucas Tpke/Ulster County Rt. 1. Go about 2½ miles and you will see a big green sign on your left, which is lit at night, and says Epworth Camp and Retreat Center. Turn in there and follow the directions below.

Directions Once at the Camp: We will be staying at Rosebush Lodge, and having our classes in the dining hall. After you arrive at Camp Epworth and turn into the driveway [Epworth Lane], turn left at the welcome sign. You will pass a big white house on your right, Manor House. Continue on and you will see the little red Office building on your left, and further on the barn will pass on your left. Ahead of you is the dining hall parking lot. Jog around to your left and continue on the road by the dining hall. Across from the dining hall is Rosebush. You can park near Rosebush. Please do not park in the entrance area as we may need to unload things there.
